Curriculum information

- **Science:** Animals inc. humans and States of matter

- **RE:** Our focus will be Hinduism and specifically learning about Diwali.
- **Music:** Viking Saga songs and linked composing inspired by Grieg's In the hall of the mountain king. Composing using Garageband
- **Art and D&T:** Sculpture in Art lessons and sewing skills to make a Viking purse in D&T.
- **PE:** Tennis, Cricket and Athletics
- **Computing:** Coding crash-course
- **French:** 'Presenting Myself' unit – listening, speaking, reading and writing.
- **PSHE:** Jigsaw– Relationships and Changing Me

Weekly Maths homework will be set on MyMaths. **Homework is expected every Friday – you can submit it online or bring it in.** If you need a paper copy, then please let your class teacher know.
