



**Art - Intent**

At Cunningham Hill Infant School, we intend for all our children to experience and enjoy using a range of materials and techniques as well as encouraging them to develop their art skills in a creative and imaginative manner. We also want our children to have the opportunity to develop ideas and express their individuality, feelings and emotions. We also feel it is important for children to develop a love of a range of existing Art, through the study of artists. We aim to encourage an appreciation of art and the confidence to express their views.

EAD (Development Matters)

The development of children’s’ artistic and cultural awareness supports their imagination and creativity. It is important that children have regular opportunities to engage with the arts, enabling them to explore and play with a wide range of media and materials. The quality and variety of what children see, hear and participate in is crucial for developing their understanding, self-expression, vocabulary and ability to communicate through the arts. The frequency, repetition and depth of their experiences are fundamental to their progress in interpreting and appreciating what they hear, respond to and observe.
